Gospel Reflection

Saint Luke lists the political and religious leaders in his gospel into order to emphasize that the Word of God really entered into human time and history as pointed out by John the Baptist, who announced the presence of Jesus the Messiah. John fulfills our understanding of a prophet: one who pushes for change; who denounces the injustices of the system, who points his finger against power in all its forms – religious, economic, military – and dares to cry out in the face of the tyrant. But there is something else that John the Baptist does: He gives to the people "a knowledge of salvation, of the remission of their sins" (Luke 1:77). While the prophets of the past announced a future salvation, John the Baptist announces that salvation is now present in Christ. John the Baptist's life can be summed up in the image of a finger pointing to the one who was coming: Jesus Christ. If we are to take on John's role of preparing the way in today's world, our lives also will become the pointing fingers of living witnesses who demonstrate that Jesus can be found and that he is near. Jesus is the fulfillment of our longing, our hoping and waiting. Jesus alone can transform the deserts of our lives into living gardens of beauty and nourishment for the world.
