## **Gospel Reflection**

The women we see in today's First Reading and Gospel were poor because they were widows, which meant they were completely dependent on their male relatives for their livelihood. To be widowed meant not only losing a spouse, but more tragically, losing the one on whom you were totally dependent. Widows were forced to live off of the generosity of other male relatives and anyone in the community who might provide for their needs. Despite the poor and dependent character of their lives, they show great generosity in sharing what little they had. Totally dependent on the grace of God, yet they were indeed rich in God's mercy. Their example of faith and generosity is grounded in the love of God: their love for God and God's love for them. They were stewards and not owners of their meagre possessions. These poor widows teach us that dependence, far from being oppressive and depressive, can really lead to a life lived in deep joy and profound gratitude.
