Gospel Reflection

There are many nets that are spread out to catch us in these times. There are various nets of consumerism, that can easily tangle us in a mesh of artificial need and worry about ability to pay. There is also the net of image-building and financial growth. These nets are to the detriment of human and spiritual values. We pray that we may be taken caught up in God's own net where life, even with its faults, holds out a promise of goodness, acceptance and hope. We must involve ourselves in spreading this net. Like Peter we are commissioned to "be fishers of people" and if we spread the net at the command of the Lord, we too can take every type of person into God's net of forgiveness, meaning, love and hope. This is our vocation and duty as Christians. Thankfully, God's purpose for us is not dependent on our worthiness. God does not wait for us to be worthy before calling us to a share in his loving service to others. Indeed, our very sense of unworthiness creates an opening for Christ to work through us. If, like Peter, we are called to work with Jesus, we will do so as wounded healers, trying to practice what we preach.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025

The Jubilee of the Year 2025 is an opportunity for all people to enter into a pilgrimage of hope. Whether we celebrate locally (in our dioceses, cathedrals or Canada's National Shrines) or make a pilgrimage to Rome, we are called to search for signs of hope and be signs of hope in our families, for our neighbours, the imprisoned, the sick and dying, the young and old. Indeed, hope does not disappoint! The "Jubilee" name comes from the instrument used to mark its launch. In this case, the instrument in question is the yobel, the ram's horn, used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This (Jewish) holiday occurs every year, but it takes on special significance when it marks the beginning of a Jubilee Year. We can find an early indication of it in the Bible: a Jubilee year was to be marked every 50 years, since this would be an "extra" year, one which would happen every seven weeks of seven years, i.e., every 49 years (cf. Leviticus 25:8-13). Even though it wasn't easy to organise, it was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation, and involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields.
