PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18-25

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated every year from January 18 to January 25. During this week, Christians are reminded of Jesus's prayer for his disciples and everyone's well-being. Christians come together to pray for their unity¹. The theme for the 2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is "You shall love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself" (Luke 10:27).

Gospel Reflection-Pilgrimage

The Baptism of Jesus highlights the role that Jesus has on earth which is rooted in His unique relationship to God the Father. Jesus is the "Beloved Son" of the Father, who anoints Jesus with the Holy Spirit for his unique mission as Saviour of the world. This foreshadows his death and resurrection, so we might be full partakers in God's Kingdom, on earth and in Heaven. Jesus is not the Spirit-filled Son of God for Himself, but for all God's people, past, present and still to be born. The new and final era of Salvation History begins when Jesus is Baptized and continues with our own Baptism. By our Baptism we are anointed to become full partakers in God's life, which we are to cultivate throughout out life by lives of loving service and self-forgetfulness. In our daily lives we are privileged to hear the words that Jesus heard from the heavens: "You are my beloved son or daughter. On you my favour rests." By our union with Christ in Baptism we are made sharers in Christ's divine Life. A gift only God alone can give.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025

The year 2025 is a special or Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church, which occurs every 25 years. This follows a Biblical tradition found in the Book of Leviticus, which was an opportunity for new beginnings by forgiving debts, restoring lost property to their original owners, and renewing the Covenant with God. On Christmas Eve Pope Francis inaugurated the Jubilee Year of 2025, with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's. Today, December 29, the Feast of the Holy Family, Archbishop Mulhall opened the Jubilee for the Archdiocese of Kingston. One of the special projects for the Archdiocese is to emphasize the Sacrament of holy Matrimony. Recognizing, that due to COVID and other circumstances, many couples were not married in the Catholic Church, this Jubilee Year is an excellent opportunity to invite couples, whether living common law or married outside the Church, to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony in the Catholic Church in the presence of a priest or deacon and two witnesses. This would be an excellent opportunity for those who wish to draw closer to Christ and deepen their religious practice of the Catholic Faith in their families.


