GOSPEL REFLECTION

The command to love God and our neighbour is not new. It formed an important prayer for all Jewish people. It is this prayer that Jesus quotes. Once again we see that Jesus has come to fulfill the Old Testament. He does this as his supreme sacrifice of love on the Cross. In the month of November we also celebrate the sacrifice of the countless men and women, the saints of God, who show us how to love and sacrifice our lives for God and neighbour. We remember the sacrifice of those who died in war to preserve freedom. We sacrifice and pray for the souls of our loved ones who have died. In all of this we see and live the positive meaning of sacrifice as something borne or endured for the good of others, as in the case of a parent who stays up all night to care for an ailing child. The sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary was his supreme gift for our human race. His sacrifice on the Cross was allsufficient because the one who offered it was the perfect priest and also the perfect victim, fully human and humanly perfect. His sacrifice on Calvary and its acceptance by the Father who raised Jesus from the dead, makes him a priest for ever. His sacrifice is eternal, for he lives eternally in the Father's presence to make intercession for us. At Baptism we are anointed as a priestly people to continue this sacrificial mission of Jesus.


