GOSPEL REFLECTION

When Jesus says to the woman by the well: "Give me a drink", he is not pretending to be thirsty. Rather it is Christ expressing the divine thirst for souls. For us, too, the thirst for God, which every human being possesses, is not something we pretend nor is it cosmetic. It is real, and it is a fundamental characteristic of our human nature, which the woman by the well acknowledges when she says "Sir, give me this water, that I may not thirst, nor come here to draw." The transforming power of Christ, revealed in his Transfiguration last Sunday, is now at work in the woman at the well and therefore in us as well. And so we admire the Samaritan woman. She is able to acknowledge her sinful past and accept the living water from Christ. We too, along with those preparing for Baptism, are invited to acknowledge our sinfulness, believe in the grace of God that can transform us inwardly and so change us more and more into the image of Christ. Then one with Christ we are be to worship God in spirit and in truth.

COLLECTIONS AT MASS

A few people have suggested that we pass the collection basket at Mass again and that this might bring in more revenue. There are a number of factors to consider: 1) There already is a very large amount of money that comes in "loose," that is, non envelope. 2) After Covid there are not as many people volunteering as before. We do not have any ushers. 3) Those who use PAD feel awkward when they do not put anything into the basket. In the past many of them asked for envelopes in order that they not to appear to be not contributing. Ordering all these extra envelopes increases the overall cost, plus it is time consuming for the collection counters to open a large number of empty envelopes. Given the large amount of loose money that is in the collection each week, I don't think that passing the basket would bring a sufficient amount of money, but thank you for your suggestions.


