# **Gospel Reflection**


While the Ten Commandment are phrased in the negative, the Beatitudes are positive statements, which build on and complete the Ten Commandments. The Beatitudes raise the bar for those who seek to be disciples of Jesus. They invite us to have the courage to be counter cultural in this world. They also invite us to meditate on Christ's words, to delight in them, and to apply them to our daily decisions. The Psalm reminds us that if we do so, we will be like trees planted near the flowing waters that provide nourishment and strength even in times of drought in order that we may produce the good fruits of the Kingdom. The Beatitudes also stretch our vision beyond this life to the promise of life eternal in heaven. We need to be far sighted and know the ultimate goal of our lives as Christians. This may involve sacrificing some good pleasures now, in order to achieve future pleasures. Let us pray that we may always know that we are truly blessed, even when trials and difficulties arise. Jesus our Saviour walks with us in our passion.

# **JUBILEE YEAR 2025**

Jubilee: Quoting the prophet Isaiah, the Gospel of Luke describes Jesus' mission in this way: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (Luke 4:18-19; cf. Isaiah 61:1-2). Jesus lives out these words in his daily life, in his encounters with others and in his relationships, all of which bring about liberation and conversion. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year," since it is a time in which God's holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years; later, in 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years, and in 1470, Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. There have also been "extraordinary" Holy Years: for example, in 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900th anniversary of the Redemption, and in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an extraordinary jubilee. The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has also changed through the centuries: originally the Holy Year consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door. By participating in the Holy Year, one is granted a plenary indulgence.

#### PREPARING FOR LENT

Before Ash Wednesday catches you unawares, make a point of sitting down—at the kitchen table, or at the chapel—and give some thought to how you want to spend this Lent.

There are three holy practices which Catholics are called to embrace in penitential seasons like Lent. These three practices are *prayer*, *fasting*, *and almsgiving*.

As Catholics, we ought to pray every day. Prayer is conversation and communion with the God who made us and loves us. No relationship would flourish if we failed to spend time in the presence of a loved one, conversing with them and offering them genuine attention.

The Bible spells out specific spiritual benefits of fasting. It produces humility (Ps 69:10). It shows our sorrow for our sins (1 Sam 7:6). It clears a path to God (Dan 9:3). It is a means of discerning God's will (Ezr 8:21) and a powerful method of prayer (8:23). It's a mark of true conversion (Jl 2:12). Lent is an important time for almsgiving, and each of us must give according to our situation. Almsgiving is not the tithing you're already doing—it's giving above and beyond what you


