Gospel Reflection

In the time of Jesus, a man had the right to divorce his wife, but the wife did not have the same right to divorce her husband. This was an injustice. There were two opposite opinions in Judaism. One stated that it was lawful to divorce one's wife for any reason; the other said that a grave reason was necessary. So once again the Pharisees hoped to trap Jesus by forcing him to adopt a position in favour of one or the other opinion. However, they received an answer they did not expect: "...What God has joined together, no human being must separate." The law of Moses about divorce is seen by Christ as an in justice. Christ re-proposed the original ideal of the indissoluble union between man and woman -- "one flesh". This, at least for his disciples, must be the form of marriage. In this way marriage becomes a way of being united to Christ through love of the other, a real path of sanctification. Let us pray that this high ideal Christ sets before us may help couples prepare more seriously for marriage and be more willing to embrace the challenges, tears and purification that can lead to selflessness and holiness.
