

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Light and darkness and day and night are a few of the contrasts found in St. John's Gospel. Jesus was buried at sundown; Mary Magdalene comes in the darkness of the early morning to the tomb; but now the day dawns; light fills the sky; and Jesus is risen from the dead. Today we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus by rising from darkness and death in our own lives. The Risen Lord, represented by the Easter candle burning with warmth and light, invites us to leave behind the works of darkness, and to renounce and reject anything in our lives which is wrong or selfish. This Easter day, as the disciples joined to him by Baptism, we resolve to walk always as children of the light, following his footsteps. We are invited to renew our baptismal promises. These are to reject darkness, evil and sin and to resolve to follow Jesus Christ from now on, in a life of goodness and love, shaped by his powerful example. In this resolve we are supported and guided by the Holy Spirit, whom he promised to share with us and on whom we can always rely. So together, we restate our baptismal promises with joy.

EASTER MESSAGE FROM BISHOP MCGRATH, CCCB PRESIDENT

The celebration of Easter is the time when we as Christians renew our baptismal promises. It is through the life-giving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ that we are united with Him. Easter takes us beyond the Cross of sorrow and disappointment to the joy and hope that comes from knowing the Risen Lord. This experience of Christ transformed the disciples. They came to know that His love is for every human person and that the fullness of eternal life is found in Him alone. This is the promise and hope that Easter brings into our lives! "Hope does not disappoint" (Rom 5:5). Easter calls us to promote with renewed zeal the witness of our faith by the living testimony of our lives. It calls us to move beyond the tomb of human emptiness by sharing with conviction the good news of the Resurrection. This Easter, let us rise up with Christ to meet the world and our culture with a renewed conviction to live our faith authentically in serving our brothers and sisters in ways that will bring them hope and joy in Christ.
