GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today's Gospel Bartimaeus cries out as Jesus was passing by, understood that it was the opportunity of his life. The reaction of those present shows how we tend to keep misery hidden, so as not to disturb the sight and dreams of those who are well. Bartimaeus is not blind; he is only sightless. He sees better with his heart than many of those around him, because he has faith and cherishes hope. More than that, it is this interior vision of faith which also helps him to recover his external vision of things. "Your faith has made you well," Jesus says to him. A Prayer for Sight from Origen (185-253): May the Lord Jesus touch our eyes, as he did those of the blind. Then we shall begin to see in visible things those which are invisible. May he open our eyes to gaze not on present realities, but on the blessings to come. May he open the eyes of our heart to contemplate God in Spirit, through Jesus Christ the Lord, to whom belong power and glory through all eternity. Amen.


