Gospel Reflection

Like the disciples of Jesus we tend to think of Jesus as the Messiah in worldly terms as a King. Jesus' passion as he stands before Pilate reveals the true image of kingship and power that Jesus reveals and wishes us to learn. Jesus is a King, not in terms of dominating or conquering or subjugating people, but in terms of offering his life for their benefit and salvation. While Jesus invites us to accept his will and the will of his Father, it is not forced. It is an invitation to the greatest freedom, the freedom of spirit. That is, because the Kingdom of God lives among us in our hearts. Outside forces cannot guarantee peace, love or happiness. These things reside in and flow from our heart and our relationship with God through Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit. As Jesus reminded us that the great must serve the least, so service in the kingdom flows from what we give and not what we amass.

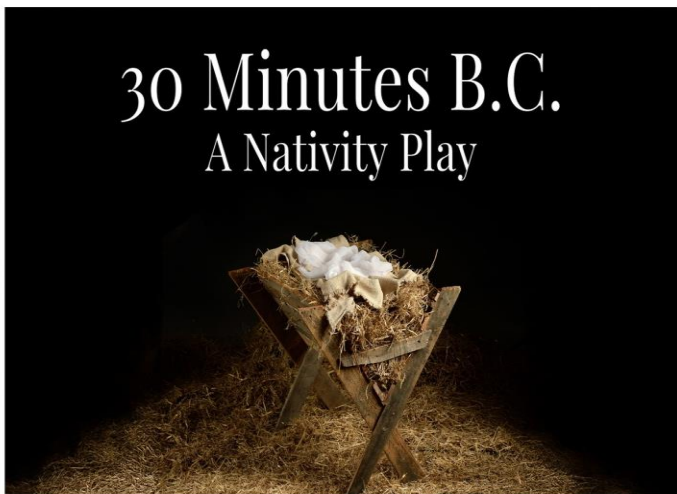
