GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today’s celebration the peaceful figure of Jesus rises above the hostility and anger of the crowds and the legal process. Jesus remains a true model of reconciliation, forgiveness and peace. In the midst of his own agony and trial, we realize the depths of Jesus’ passion for reconciliation: In his trial he brings together even Pilate and Herod in friendship; from the Cross, he forgives his persecutors and the dying; he allows even a thief to steal paradise! Throughout his account, St. Luke stresses the innocence of Jesus, who is the victim of the powers of evil and who goes to his death in fulfillment of his Father’s will. Luke emphasizes the mercy, compassion, and healing power of Jesus, who does not go to death lonely and deserted, but is accompanied by others who follow him on the way of the cross. In Luke’s moving story, the palms of triumph and the cross of the Passion are not a contradiction. Herein lies the heart of the mystery proclaimed during Holy Week. Jesus gave himself up voluntarily to the Passion; he was not crushed by forces greater than himself. He freely faced crucifixion, and in death he was ultimately triumphant. Let us rejoice in the triumph of mercy.

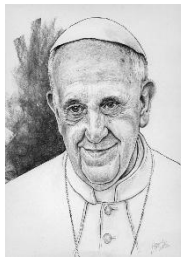


ORDINATION OF DEACON JUDE THUSIAR TO THE PRIESTHOOD
