Gospel Reflection

One might say that Advent comes at an inopportune time, the busiest time of the year, when we get pulled into the Christmas rush. But it is precisely at this busiest time that we need the Advent message. It is a reminder that as disciples of Jesus we cannot be concerned only about our material and short-term needs. These can only satisfy our physical needs for a short time. We must also be attuned to our spiritual life and the things that can give life to the spirit. Thus, while Advent talks about the two comings of Christ (past and future), it also reminds us of a third. Christ's daily coming to us in this moment. And we, as the Body of Christ, have the duty to make him present to others by our caring and sharing. In this new Advent season, Christ is ready to give us a fresh vision and the grace we need to lose ourselves and find God. Christ wants to work in and through us for the greater honour and glory of his Father. That is why he expects great things from us, which are in fact possible by the grace of God at work in our lives.

Eternal Father, grant that we may recognize the coming of your Son in the worship we offer, in the Scriptures we read, in the needy we meet, and in those who show us kindness and forgiveness, Through Christ our Lord.
