Gospel Reflection

The first reading shocks us: "The Lord has been pleased to crush his servant with suffering." Why would it please God to crush his servant with suffering? As the reading progresses, we see that the one who is crushed bears fruit. Suffering has a silver lining. If endured willingly, then a positive outcome lies ahead. This is the prediction of Christ, God's Suffering Servant: "by his sufferings shall my servant justify many, taking their faults on himself." In other words, "the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Service and suffering must characterize Christian living as we seek to imitate Christ. Our own suffering as well as Christ's death on the Cross might seem like a defeat. Yet, with the eyes of faith, we know that Christ was not defeated but was a conqueror. Through his sufferings and death, he conquered sin and death and purified all of us who lack the fullness of grace, which is love. It is love that is poured out upon that Cross and which is given to us. The Lord willingly underwent all that he did for our sake because he loves us more than we can possibly imagine. He shows us that suffering willingly embraced and endured is redemptive. With the legislation that encourages assisted suicide, we need to hear more than ever about the redemptive qualities of suffering, how something though in and of itself not good, can nevertheless sow the seeds of redemption. Suffering for the Christian is an invitation to love more than ever with arms outstretched like Christ.



Through this sacrament people receive comfort in their suffering; they are restored in spirit; and sometimes they even experience the return of physical health. In this Sacrament Jesus unites our suffering with his passion and death so that through our suffering we can participate in his saving and healing work. The sacrament also reminds us that God wants to give comfort to the suffering and wants us to relieve suffering where we can.
